Inauguration of 5T Transformed Schools

UPHC Bidanasi conferred NQAS Certification



Bidanasi Urban Primary Health Centre (UPHC) is once again conferred with the National Quality Assurance Standards (NQAS) certification from Government of India, in recognition of high standards of quality in the hospital. SCB MCH steps up to treat accident victims

SCB Medical College and Hospital (SCB MCH) started its preparation immediately on receiving the news of Bahanaga train accident on the evening of June 2, 2023, as per the instruction of Hon'ble CM Shri Naveen Patnaik. Doctors and paramedical staff were deployed, teams were formed with specialists comprising heads of the surgery, orthopedic, and neurosurgery departments to provide the best treatment, the trauma and non-trauma casualty were immediately vacated, and extra beds arranged to accommodate the accident victims.

A total of 201 critical patients from different states were admitted to SCB MCH. Doctors, Paramedical Staff, Hospital Managers worked 24/7, giving their best effort to save the victims. Senior doctors, house surgeons, post graduate and under graduate MBBS students went beyond their duty to donate blood, contributing 746 units in a single day.

For hassle-free treatment of the victims, District Administration, Cuttack Municipal Corporation and all allied departments worked in tandem. Officials of CMC and District Administration were deployed to render their services round the clock. Proper coordination made the process smooth and enabled the medicos to provide the best possible treatment to the patients.

Support poured in from all sectors. Volunteers, comprising of local people and NGOs came forward to render their services in all possible ways. People queued up to donate blood. Free food and drinking water was distributed to the relatives and attendants of victims.

Help Desks

Two Help Desks were set up inside SCB MCH and five helpline numbers were opened to provide information to family members and relatives of the victims. CMC had set up a 24/7 Help Desk at Cuttack Railway Station to assist the relatives of the train accident victims. It provided information on patients' whereabouts, and the staff escorted the relatives to SCB MCH.



Nepal Teenager reunited with parents



Ramanand Paswan, a 16-year-old native from Nepal was travelling to Chennai on June 2, 2023 in the Coromondal Express, that met with accident at Bahanaga. He suffered critical injuries and was immediately taken to SCB MCH. The boy was unable to speak as he had multiple injuries, including major injuries on the chest. Staff of SCB tried to communicate through writing and with great difficulty got information about his family in Nepal. Meanwhile one of

the staff saw a news in local TV where people from Nepal were enquiring about their relatives, who were travelling in the ill-fated train. He immediately contacted the TV crew and collected the phone numbers of the Nepalese families. He contacted Nepal Embassy and informed his parents, who took a train to reach Odisha. On reaching Bhubaneswar, a vehicle was arranged to bring them to Cuttack to meet their son. They were provided a room in SCB, along with all kinds of support.

Newly married couple reunited

A newly married couple got separated after the train accident. The lady was rescued in an unconscious state and taken to Balasore District Headquarter hospital and later shifted to SCB MCH. The government officials traced the husband with the aid of Help Desk and got him admitted at SCB MCH, in the same ward and adjacent beds.

Hon'ble CM Shri Naveen Patnaik declared June 3, 2023 as Day of Mourning.

CMC Council Meetings

Council Meetings are conducted regularly every month by CMC to discuss on the matters of public interest and take consentaneous decisions. It is presided over by Mayor and attended by Deputy Mayor, CMC Commissioner, Deputy Commissioners, Standing Committee Chairpersons, Corporators, Officers and Staff from all Sections, Line departments such as WATCO, JICA, Civil Supplies etc.

Highlights of the Council Meetings held in the last quarter.

12th Council Meeting, April 12, 2023



- The external manpower agencies empaneled with CMC to pay the wages of different categories of employers as per the directive of State Labour department. This includes Gardener (Semi skilled), Auto loader (Unskilled), Dog Catcher and Animal Catcher (Semi Skilled),
- The empaneled agencies providing man power support to CMC is notified to provide EPF/ESI facility to all its employees, along with regularization of salary within one month, failing which strict action would be taken.
- The enhancement incentive of employees who have been working for CMC since the last 25 years, to be increased. These employees to be included under the Nominal Muster Roll (NMR) and categorized according to their skill set like skilled, unskilled and semi-skilled.
- To reimburse the medical expenditure of Helper Govinda Senapati, injured during duty hours.
- All DLR/NMR working through external agencies to be provided Variable Dearness Allowance (VDA) along with their daily wage, as per their skill category.

13th Council Meeting, May 24, 2023

- Works Department to be requested for fund allocation towards lighting of Madhusudan Setu and it's maintenance for 3 years. Subsequently it was decided that CMC will take over the maintenance work.
- To build a Kalyan Mandap along with Market complex in the place allocated for building of Market complex, besides Taladanda Canal at Jobra side.
- A market complex to be created for the benefit of small businessmen near Ranihat Clock Tower, through OBCC.



14th Council Meeting, June 27, 2023

- To desilt all drains for monsoon preparedness
- Increase of 4% Dearness Allowance of all employees.



Hearty Farewell at SCB MCH



The discharged train accident victims were given a farewell with all provisions and support to travel home. On June 8, 2023 eight patients from West Bengal were provided vehicles to travel home along with fruits, water, health drink and

energy drink for transit by CMC, apart from presenting them Rs 3000 each from the CM Relief Fund.

EXPOSURE VISIT

SUDA Team from Chhattisgarh

A team of 13 members from the State Urban Development Agency (SUDA), Chhattisgarh visited Cuttack on March 27, 2023 to gain practical knowledge on the Women Self Help Group (WSHG) and Transgender SHG operated projects under MUKTA. They visited Solid Waste Management (SWM) and National Urban Livelihoods Mission (NULM) convergence projects like Sewage Treatment Plant at Mattagajpur, Water Treatment Plant at Pratap Nagari, a park near Trisulia Bridge and other projects. The team was guided by CMC City Mission Manager, CMC Sanitation Expert, and a Member from SUDA, Odisha.

USAID Officials visit

A delegation from USAID led by Mission Director Ms. Veena Reddy, senior foreign diplomat of USA Government, visited the 60 KLD Septage Treatment Plant (SeTP) at Mattagajpur and 8MLD Water Treatment Plant (WTP) at Pratap Nagari, on April 27, 2023. Both the units are maintained by transgender SHG. The SeTP at Mattagajpur is the 1st ever Urban Local Body (ULB) in the state, to engage transgender SHG. The team highly appreciated the effort of CMC and WATCO for empowering the transgenders through provision of livelihood opportunities as well as the decentralized, sustainable, community-led livelihood model in sanitation.

A 13-member delegate from Tamil Nadu led by Additional Commissioner Municipal Administration Ms.R.Lalitha came for an exposure visit to Cuttack on June 9, 2023. They visited the storm water and septic tank cleaning sites as well as interacted with Swachh Karmis and Swachh Sathis to understand the septic tank cleaning system of CMC and Private Sanitation Service Organisation.



SEBC Survey

The survey of Socially & Educationally Backward Classes (SEBC) was successfully conducted from May 1 to June 6, 2023. Survey centers were opened in all the wards of the City from May 1 to 19, followed by door to door visit till June 6, 2023. CMC Commissioner Shri Nikhil Pavan Kalyan visited the survey centers to inspect the ongoing survey. He discussed with the concerned officials and Corporator for the smooth operation of the centre, as well as urged the people to fill the form on time. Shri Santosh Kumar Dash, Additional Secretary, Department of Co-operation also visited several SEBC Survey Centres as an Observer. He interacted with the Enumerators and Supervisors as well as other officials and reviewed the procedures in the centres.

Children enjoyed playing on the swings, witnessing the traditional Odissi dance show and savouring the delicious pithas. Each little girl was gifted a story book and a gift voucher worth Rs 500. The happiness of the little girls was escalated when they were taken to a mall for shopping. They brought dresses, toys and things that fancied them, from the gift coupon. Special care was taken to make the little girls happy on this joyous occasion. Among others present were Mayor Shri Subhash Chandra Singh, Deputy Mayor, Barabati-Cuttack MLA, Choudwar-Cuttack MLA, Deputy Commissioner SIO and other officials of CMC.





Zero Waste RRR Centre

A Reduce, Reuse and Recycle (RRR) centre was set up at Bikash Bhawan on June 1, 2023, as part of a nation-wide campaign 'Meri LiFE, Mera Swachh Shehar', for protecting and conserving the environment by adopting sustainable living habits. It is open for citizens to deposit surplus, unused or waste materials like plastic items, used cloths, footwear, toys etc, which is handed over to different stakeholders for reuse, refurbish or recycle to create new products.

Udyam

A Swachh Bharat Mission IEC Programme, "Udyam" was organised at Saheed Bhawan from April 4 to 6, 2023, to sensitize the Swachha Sathis and Swachha Karmis on various IEC programmes for a garbage free City. Around 1500 Swachha Sathis, Swachha Karmis as well as drivers and loaders of waste collection vans attended the programme along with the Corporators.

It was inaugurated by Mayor Shri Subash Chandra Singh in presence of Deputy Mayor, CMC Commissioner, Deputy Commissioners and other officials of CMC. On the inaugural day, a Swachhata Ratha was launched to create awareness among the people on the importance of waste management.

Several activities were organised during the 3-day event, that included a mass cleaning drive from Qadam-e-Rasool to City Hospital, and distribution of gloves and caps to the participants. On the occasion, dedicated and sincere Swachha Sathis and Karmis were felicitated, followed by Badakhana at CMC Kalyan Mandap.



Workshop on Strengthening Routine Immunization

World Health Organization (WHO) conducted a 1-day training on strengthening routine immunization services on May 24, 2023 at the conference hall of UPHC, Bidanasi. It was attended by Medical Superintendents, Medical Officers and Managerial Staff of all the UPHCs and UHCs under CMC.

Observance of Swachhata Pakhwada

All the UPHCs and UHCs under CMC area observed Swachhata Pakhwada in April 2023, to create awareness among communities on the significance of maintaining cleanliness. This fortnightly awareness drive educated people about the virtues of good sanitation practices and motivated them to adopt proper sanitation model for a healthy life.



Ama Pokhari Abhijan at Cuttack City

Ama Pokhari Abhijan is the vision of Hon'ble CM of Odisha to make the state water secure and ecologically diverse, by rejuvenating water bodies in a natural and sustainable manner. It revolves around enhancing the quality of water and sustaining the rejuvenation with the help of community. Under this programme several waterbodies in the City are now being rejuvenated with the help of Mission Shakti Groups (MSGs).

The resurrection, rejuvenation and restoration work of Nilakantheswar pond, Utkal Balashrama pond and the 7-acre Ganga Mandir pond are almost complete. The process includes de-watering, de-weeding, de-silting, strengthening of embankments with excavated silt and soil from the waterbody, removal of encroachment in the boundary, plantation in the embankment and walking track. In the first phase, drone survey of 23 ponds are completed along with selection of Implementing Agencies. A total of 50 ponds will be rejuvenated in phase-wise manner.



Drink from Tap

The 1st and 2nd phases of Drink from Tap (DFT) Mission under Government of Odisha 5T initiative have been successfully completed in Cuttack city. Out of the 55 DFT zones, 10 zones each were covered in the two phases. More than 95% of the work has been completed so far. Different ancillary works are being undertaken by WATCO in the rest 35 zones, which is scheduled to be completed by December 2023 in phase-wise manner. Under the project, 24/7 drinking water will be supplied round the clock through taps installed in households and all household connections to be replaced with water meters throughout the city. To monitor the project across the city and assess the progress, the 1st Departmental Coordination Committee meeting was held on Dec 2, 2022, and the 2nd meeting was held on April 11, 2023.

May Day Wages Announcement

On Labour's Day, Mayor Shri Subhash Chandra Singh announced the incentive allowance enhancement of 227 Nominal Muster Roll (NMR) employees of CMC, at Saheed Bhawan. The enhanced amount of Rs 2000 is above their earlier incentive allowance and will be effective from May 1, 2023. On the occasion, he also issued a minimum wage order for 102 daily wage workers.

CDA Authority Meeting



The 134th Authority Meeting of Cuttack Development Authority was held on May 30, 2023, at the CDA Conference Hall. Based on the feedback of citizens, several developmental plans were thoroughly discussed, that include building a mini stadium, park, playground, market complex, vending zones and a convention centre. A regulatory policy and a comprehensive development plan (CDP) for the newly added villages will be prepared, to take up the

developmental activities. 102 more villages will also be added to CDA soon. The horticulture wing of the Authority will take up massive plantation drive in and outside the City, to make Cuttack greener. It was presided by Chairman Shri Anil Kumar Samal and attended by Mayor Shri Subash Chandra Singh, CDA Vice Chairman and concerned officials.

Auction of Commercial land at CNBT

Cuttack Development Authority is the Nodal agency for the functioning of Cuttack Netaji Bus Terminal (CNBT) located over 15 acres of land at Khan Nagar Junction on the Ring Road. In May 2023, 1.684 acres of land was auctioned for commercial purpose, at a price of Rs.28.70 crores.



New Villages under CDA jurisdiction

145 Revenue villages are now included in the jurisdiction of Cuttack Development Authority as per the notification of H&UD department, GoO dated May 2, 2023. One hundred and two more villages will soon be added in the ambit of CDA. The Authority will now regulate the infrastructural developmental works of these villages like development of roads, parks, community and health centres etc., as well as plan approval for layout/plotted development schemes or housing facilities in these areas.

De-Fogging Machines

Two defogging machines are engaged by Cuttack Municipal Corporation for dust control since May 1, 2023. Each machine covers a total of 30 kms everyday across the city.



Mechanized Sweeping Machines

CMC has engaged two mechanical sweeping machines, which operates from 10pm to 5am everyday vacuuming up dirt and debris alongwith cleaning the roads. The machines covers 40 kms each everyday.



Mission Shakti SHGs

Capacity Building of Mission Shakti SHGs

A capacity building workshop on Rejuvenating Urban Water Bodies through Community Partnership, was held at Saheed Bhawan on April 21, 2023, for the Mission Shakti SHG members. 130 members from 13 SHGs were oriented on their respective roles as Implementing Agency for the rejuvenation of the water bodies. The Technical Session was followed by a question and answer round and distribution of participation certificates.

Empowering Mission Shakti SHGs through Entrepreneurship

Food stalls will soon come up in the city manned by Mission Shakti Self Help Groups. Three SHGs have been finalized by Cuttack Municipal Corporation to operate and manage one of the two distinct zones of the Food Court at Taladanda Canal Park. This will enable empowerment of SHGs

through entrepreneurship as well as promote women-centric food stalls, preparing and selling local delicacies, in its best possible manner. The members of Jay Jagannath SSG, Maa Kali MMS and Trinath Shakti Group-2, are provided training on operating and managing the food court.



Kine House O&M by Mission Shakti SHGs

In order to provide services for the uncared animals and control bovine menace in the city, CMC has established a Kine house at Satichoura. Mahalaxmi Mission Shakti SHG who has been finalized for its operation and maintenance, is provided training on various aspects of management of the place. The group will keep records of the daily stock entries of cattle

received and released, claimers details, stock entry of cattle feeding items, asset register, official visit register, house decoration and hygiene & cleanliness of the surrounding. The idea behind selection of WSHG for operating and managing the Kine house is to empower Mission Shakti Groups by providing different avenues to showcase their skills and enable them to earn a decent living.

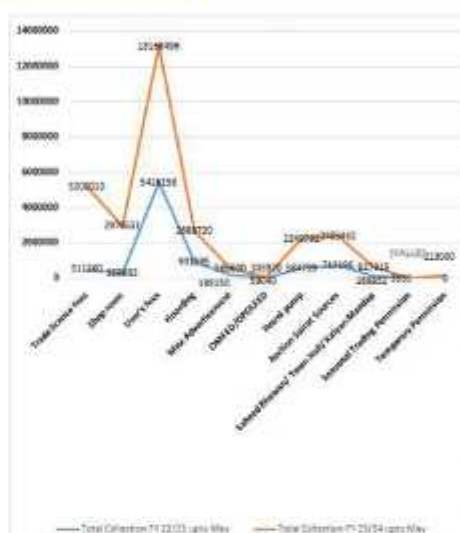
